


THINGS TO SEE AND DO

There's a pond just south of Uxbridge. We think it must be stocked. The last time we were there, we saw at least half a dozen fishermen (one only four years old), some on the shore, some in boats out in the middle of the pond.

Fishing isn't really our thing, but we had fun wandering around and exploring the pond. There are benches; if the weather cooperates, it wouldn't be a bad place for a picnic.

There's golf, as well. The Foxbridge Golf and Country Club (foxbridgegolf.ca) is south of Uxbridge and east of Main Street. They have an 18-hole course and a driving range. There's also the Wooden Sticks Golf Club (woodensticks.com), located just west of FoxBridge.

The Roxy (roxytheatres.com) may be the coolest-looking movie theatre I've ever seen. It's a bit like a giant, corrugated silo turned on its side. They're showing Iron Man 2 and The Back-Up Plan. Book launch, dinner, movie?

Take 401 East to the 404; head north.

Take Exit 41 for Regional Rd 40 / Bloomington Rd.; turn right (head east).

Continue onto County Rd 47, right into Uxbridge.

From the East

Take the 401 West to Brock Street / Hwy 12; head north.

Turn left on County Rd 47, right into Uxbridge.
